Service Descriptions

Employment Services: Through discovery of interests and strengths, we assist individuals seeking employment within community businesses.

• Adult Life Transition Program: A school transition program for building the bridge from high school to employment and adult living with community connections and job-related skills.

Recreation and Leisure: This program promotes choice, wellness, and well-being through social recreation within the community. Activities are based off the interests expressed by participants and provides respite for family caregivers.

• Aktion Club: One of the Kiwanis family service leadership clubs, provides an opportunity for individuals to develop initiative, leadership skills, and service in the community.

Adult Day Community Services: Participants are involved in engaging community activities and volunteerism. Individuals are supported as they learn life skills and interact with others while creating a purposeful and enjoyable day based on interests, needs, and personal goals.













Service Demographic









Adult Day Services: Volunteering, Community Involvement, Fun, and Fulfillment: As a community, we are better when everyone has opportunities to participate and contribute in meaningful ways. Portal, inc. is proud of the many volunteer contributions our participants share in partnership with other service organizations/clubs for mutual mission success.

Sixty Portal participants share their time and talents to assist in 21 impactful organizations including: Bob's Under the Bridge, Family Sharing of Ozaukee County. Lasata Senior Living, Port Washington Food Pantry, Meals on Wheels, Blue Lotus, and Cedarburg Health Services. Their decisions are based on interests, schedules, and financial resources.
